

## REFLECTING ON 2020

The messages that Ryan preached were Gospel-centered, passionate in their expression, and filled with the Holy Spirit's unction. During the weekend we experienced a move of God among our students.

Through the 2 days of this weekend there were 26 spiritual decisions for Christ. Several of those were students who trusted Jesus for the very first time as their Lord and Savior. The Gospel was preached, and God blessed it.



Lance McAfee, the student pastor of First Baptist McAlester, said of the weekend, "The 2020 D-Now was an event that truly focused on the name of Jesus. The theme was Focus and was a great reminder of where our hearts should be—focused on Jesus, sharing Jesus and serving others for the sake of the gospel. The students were able to take the gospel to the community and were challenged to live their faith by Ryan Young. There were many decisions, some of which were making Jesus their King. Others were encouraged to continue to share Jesus wherever they go."

As a pastor, I take my responsibility to the preaching ministry, shepherding of the flock, and care for God's people seriously as well. Because of this, I do not just trust anyone to teach, preach to, or train God's people at First Baptist.
